## <u>MCAS-Alt</u> Informational Text—Supplemental List

Teachers are instructed to provide the titles of published texts used to assess their students in the **ELA**–**Reading** strand.

However, Informational texts selected <u>from the following **Internet sources**</u> do *not* require a photocopy, just the <u>name of the Internet site and the title or</u> <u>topic of the text being read</u>:

- National Geographic for Kids
- Time for Kids
- Weekly Reader or Scholastic News
- News-2-You (symbol and text based)
- Unique Learning Systems (symbol and text based)
- Wonderopolis or Camp Wonderopolis
- Digital Textbooks: Name of textbook and topic
- Newsela (publishes daily news articles at five different reading levels from grades 3–12)
- Science Spin (part of Scholastic News)

For example, the teacher might include the following in the brief description:

*"(Student) read the article, Penguins, from <u>National Geographic for</u> <u>Kids</u> and answered 5 comprehension questions on a worksheet."* 

The name(s) of Internet sites and the titles/topics must be included in the student's portfolio, either:

- in the brief description for each piece of evidence,
- on a separate page with the corresponding date on which the work was completed, or
- directly on the piece of evidence.

**For example**, the teacher decides to include a **separate page**, the Internet sites, titles/topics, and dates corresponding to the data points should be listed as follows:

## 1. 9/19/17- News-2-You: Paralympics

2. 9/27/17- Scholastic News: 3D Printers Make It to the Classroom

Etc.
